

Groepskampeersafari Kenya

Met Samburu N.P., Lake Baringo, Lake Nakuru.en Maasai Mara, Amboseli, Tsavo east and Tsavo West, Mombasa 13 dagen, wekelijks, v.a.Euro 799,- (+ USD 319,- Local Payment), minimaal 4 , maximaal 9 personen

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Day 1 – Samburu:

Depart Nairobi in the morning passing through the rich agricultural farmland on the slopes of Mountain Kenya to the mainly dry scrubland and open Savannah plains of Samburu Game Reserve. Here the Ewaso Nyiro River supports a wide variety of game among them elephant, buffalo, cheetah leopard, lion, grevy's zebra, reticulated giraffe, oryx and the long necked gerenuk. Accommodation in our permanent campsite beautifully set on the edge of the river under a canopy of trees, or pitch tent nearby.

Day 2 – Samburu:

Day spent game viewing in the park.

Day 3 – Baringo:

Leaving Samburu in the early morning, we make a scenic drive to the west across the Leroghi Plateau. Lunch enroute and later descend to the floor of the Great Rift Valley, arriving at Lake Baringo in the afternoon. This is a fresh water lake, which supports a great variety of birds as well as hippos and crocodiles. Indeed, the lake is reputed to be the bird-watching centre of Kenya.

Day 4 - Lake Nakuru:

Early in the morning we head south via Lake Bogoria, which is a shallow soda lake with a beautiful scenery and also home to a sizeable number of flamingos and other species of birds. The highlight, however, is the boiling hot springs and geysers, which also contribute to the beauty of the lake. After lunch, we proceed to lake Nakuru in the south - another shallow soda lake that has been described as "an ornithologists paradise and one of the world's most magnificent sights". Here one has an opportunity to see up to two million flamingos besides tens of thousands of other birds if lucky. Lake Nakuru is a rhino sanctuary and also harbors lions, warthogs, waterbucks, buffaloes, hippo and many other animals. Dinner and overnight in a campsite outside town.

Day 5 - Maasai Mara:

We head further south to Narok, camping in our permanent campsite on the Talek River, which is at the edge of the park by afternoon. Here we have stand-up tents with beds for use, if available, otherwise we pitch tent. Showers are available in the camp and meals are served in the dining mess or in the open.

Day 6 - Maasai Mara:

From the base camp, we explore the Mara region, packed with the elephant, zebra, rhino and all kinds of game throughout the year with the spectacular wildebeest migration from Serengeti occurring mainly in July and August. Being at Maasai Mara is “as if you found yourself in the New York of the natural world according to some authorities”. Indeed, you have the best opportunity of seeing all the big five.

Day 7 – Nairobi:

We break camp and drive to Narok where Maasai souvenirs can be bought and then proceed to Nairobi, arriving in the afternoon. Dinner and overnight in a campsite outside town or hotel if you wish at extra cost.

Day 8 – Amboseli:

Morning drive via Namanga on the Tanzania border and reach Amboseli early in the afternoon. We view game as we proceed to the campsite.

Day 9 – Amboseli:

Day spent exploring this park with the magnificent snow capped Mt. Kilimanjaro in the background. The waters from melted snow drain down the mountain under lava flows and surface on the Amboseli plains. Here elephant, hippo, buffalo, giraffe are likely to be seen.

Day 10 - Tsavo West:

We leave soon after breakfast for Tsavo West National Park. Visit the Chyulu Hills and the Mzima Springs, which are favourite haunts for both the hippo and crocodile, which can be seen from an underwater observation chamber if time permits. Dinner and overnight in a campsite.

Day 11 - Tsavo West:

Day spent exploring the park including the nature trails.

Day 12 - Tsavo East:

Early in the morning we drive to Tsavo East. This park come famous for its great herds of elephant still has these beasts usually covered in red dust and a variety of game and fine scenery. We visit Lugards Falls, Mudanda Rocks and Aruba Dam as we view game if time permits.

Day 13 – Mombasa:

Early morning gamedrive. Soon after breakfast we proceed to Mombasa arriving there in good time for pax to find their way to their hotels and the tour ends. Stay at Budget Hotel (niet bij de safariprijs inbegrepen) (Uiteraard is het mogelijk de reis met een paar dagen strand te verlengen)

Safari: **Euro 799,-** en USD 316,- (local payment)

What is included in the price:-

- Transport by special safari vehicle
- Services of an English -speaking driver/tour guide and cook
- All campsite fees
- All camping equipment including use of our three-person tents (each tent shared by 2 people), stools, foam mattresses except sleeping bags

- Three meals a day while on safari whether vegetarian or non-vegetarian prepared by our safari cook

What is not included in the price:-

- Game park entrance fees shown separately as **'local payment'**
- Personal travel insurance
- Flying Doctors Service for emergency evacuation cover valid for 2 months [available in our office at US\$25pp within 500km Radius or US\$50 within 1000kms from Nairobi].
- Sleeping bags [available for hire in the office at US\$15 per bag per safari with US\$ 40 refundable deposit]
- Hotel accommodation in Nairobi/Mombasa
- All international & domestic air flights and train bookings [**But can be arranged on request**]
- Balloon safari in Maasai Mara- US\$ 385 per person [**But can be arranged on request**]
- All airport/hotel/airport transfers [but can be arranged at extra cost]
- All airport taxes and visas
- All personal expenses and toiletries; e.g. mineral water, toilet tissue, laundry, telephones, beverages, TIPS, portage, etc.
- Any other extras not stated as included above
